I noticed how elegant she looked, but what really caught my eye was her earrings. They were beautiful and they perfectly matched her outfit. I commented on them, and she told me they were handmade in the southwest by a talented Native American artist. The interesting thing is, I had that same experience a few years

ago while traveling the southwest in our motorhome. We talked about watching the artist and how meticulous he was to detail and his choice of stones and colors.

Carolyn went on to explain that when she traveled, she would often take time to find a unique, special pair of earrings to purchase, helping her remember the trip. Our Editorial for this Month

Is Recycling the Answer for our Plastic Problem by Frank Russo

Everybody including the <u>LP Independent Times</u> has been urging us to recycle. We all need to get plastic out of the oceans, the landfills, the open spaces, etc.

Well, we all have been fooled again. The source of this foolery is the chemical companies themselves. The burden of cleaning up **their** mess has been placed on our shoulders through a series of clever "environment appeals" urging us the citizens to come up with ways to collect all their stuff and get it recycled,

These companies know that over 90% of plastics are not being recycled and they have known that **their** plastics cannot be recycled, and they have known it for a long time.

So why is it our problem and why should we be saddled with the cleanup responsibility?

The problem is the current corporate mentality is not to take responsibility. To them the resulting plastic waste is just the cost of doing business. We have heard it before. DDT destroying the environment – the cost of doing business, Smoking causing lung cancer – the cost of doing business. Asbestos - the cost of doing business, and on and on.

Another view is presented in an article by Davis Allen - see the link - Allen is one of the investigative researchers for the Center For Climate Integrity.

"When companies produce all of this plastic (and) are continuing to constantly expand production of plastic products, they know that ultimately all of that plastic waste will either end up in a landfill, incinerated, or in the environment," Allen said. that the plastic industry used these commercial campaigns to make consumers responsible for using less plastic instead of taking accountability for making it.

"The entire framing of individuals needing to solve this problem is basically what the industry has promoted as part of this campaign to convince us that recycling was a viable solution," Davis said.

Scams

One of our residents, **Richard Van Dyke** came across this article warning about scams using Al intelligence. It is an article researched by reporter, Kurt Knutsson, in the CyberGuy Report

FCC names its first-ever AI scammer in threat alert

"The <u>first artificial intelligence robocall scammer</u> has been officially named by the Federal Communications Commission. But is it too little, too late?

After all, Royal Tiger has already gotten away with loads of scams that have impacted millions of Americans.

Let's talk about what these headlines mean for AI scammers in general, what you still need to be on the lookout for and how to protect yourself from these sophisticated scams going forward.

So, who is the Royal Tiger cyber gang?

Royal Tiger is the first robocall gang named by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). This group is known to use sophisticated techniques in their cyber scams, such as Al voice cloning, to impersonate staff from government agencies, banks and utilities, known as "robocall" scams.

The crew consists of individuals and voice service providers operating from various countries, including India, the U.K., the United Arab Emirates, and the U.S. The group is led by Prince Jashvantlal Anand, who uses the alias "Frank Murphy," and his associate Kaushal Bhavsar. Anand has served as "CEO" of "U.S.-based companies" like Illum Telecommunication and PZ Telecommunication

What are robocalls and AI scams?

Robocalls and AI scams involve using automated calling systems and artificial intelligence to deceive and defraud individuals. Although there are a few ways to do this, scammers like Royal Tiger are now relying on AI voice cloning to create realistic-sounding voices that impersonate legitimate entities such as government agencies, banks and utility companies. Generally, these scams involve using certain trick scenarios to take advantage of their victims, like calling about credit card interest rate reductions or fake purchase authorization orders, which enable them to obtain consumers' financial and other sensitive data from the individuals that they target.

With phone spoofing techniques, it's possible to make your caller ID actually show a call from these agencies, too, to make it look more legitimate."

So, you have read it here. All we can say is BEWARE!

- Check your Apple Phones, IPad, and Apple watches. The latest update June 1 is OS 17.5.1 for iPhones and iPads, and OS 10.5 for the Apple Watch; and OS 16.7.5 for iPad Pro(1st) and iPad (5th gen) and iPhones 8 and X.
- Don't be too hasty in replacing or discarding/recycling a laptop or desktop that is newer than 5 years old, and has at least 8 GB of RAM. Look to see if your unit has the following installed capability;




